HEALTH AWARENESS ACTIVITIES

On 2nd October, 2019 Mahatma Gandhi's 150th birthday celebrations at Main campus of AIIMS Mangalagiri commemorated with Walkathon at 08 AM which started from AIIMS Mangalagiri Main gate to community hall (Ganji Venkayya function hall) with 1st& 2nd Years MBBS students, faculty and staff displaying health education material and making slogans to spread awareness about Gandhian ideology, Health and Hygiene among the community throughout the entire course of the Walkathon.



After reaching Ganji Venkayya function hall which was approx. 3 Km from AIIMS main gate, MBBS students displayed the posters on various themes which they have prepared in teams. They covered wide range of health problems like importance of cleanliness and disease prevention, Maternal and child health care, anaemia, diarrhea, cancer, geriatric health. Best three posters were judged by the clinical faculty and declared the result on the spot.





Students also prepared and performed a skit which narrated about importance of sanitation and hygiene through various case scenarios which lead to Disease causation. A free Health camp started at the same venue at 10 AM with expert doctors from the department of Community & Family Medicine, General Medicine and Orthopedics.



This camp was conducted involving faculty, nursing officers and supporting staff of AIIMS Mangalagiri. Objective of the camp was to address the health need of weavers working in Mangalagiri area. Mangalagiri Cotton sarees and dress material is famous and exported across other Indian states and also at international level.





After the health camp few faculty members and staff visited nearby weavers working places in the colony to look at their working conditions, their work timings and their health problems in particular. They are paid less as compared to their long hours of working and their main health problems are joint pain and backache due to prolong working hours in same posture.
